New York, first public talk

'Abdu'l-Bahá gave his first public talk in America on 14 April 1912 at the Church of the Ascension, whose pastor, Dr. Percy Grant, a close friend of Juliet Thompson, had previously attacked 'the Bahá'í sect'. 'Abdu'l-Bahá's transformative powers had won him over.

The altar and the whole chancel were banked with lilies, and a victor's wreath hung on the back of the Bishop's chair, where 'Abdu'l-Bahá was seated (against the rules of the Episcopal Church).

Speaking in public

'Abdu'l-Bahá almost never stood still when He spoke. He paced back and forth, and made a statement which the translator would then translate, while He would smile and nod occasionally to affirm important points.

"To hear Him was... a work of art, as well as a spiritual service. First would come this spiritual flow of thought musically expressed in a foreign tongue. Then, as the translator set forth its meaning to us, we had the added pleasure of watching 'Abdu'l-Bahá's response to the art of the translator."

Material civilization is like unto the lamp, while spiritual civilization is the light in that lamp. If the material and spiritual civilization become united, then we will have the light and the lamp together, and the outcome will be perfect.



Talk at Church of the Ascension


