On the day of the Declaration of the Bab, 23 May 1844, the first telegraph message was sent in America: "What hath God wrought", marking the beginning of technologies of communications and transportation to unite the world physically.

The Báb (1819-1850), the forerunner of the Faith who announced the coming of "Him Whom God shall make manifest", arose in Persia in 1844, and His faith also spread to Iraq by the time of His Martyrdom in 1850.

The Prophet-founder of the Bahá'í Faith, Bahá'u'lláh (1817-1892), also came from Persia (now Iran), but was exiled to Iraq, Turkey and finally to the prison-city of Akka (now in Israel). During His ministry, the Bahá'í Faith reached 13 additional countries.

Teaching Plans

It is through teaching the Faith that a religion spreads from person to person, and through them from country to country. Bahá'í geography traces how countries and islands have been opened to the Faith, and tells some of the stories of the wonderful teachers, or pioneers, who first went there. This was a conscious process directed by teaching plans, first by 'Abdu'l-Bahá until 1921 with his Tablets of the Divine Plan, then in the teaching plans of the Guardian, Shoghi Effendi (1921-1957), and now by the Universal House of Justice since 1963.
