Teaching

Smallness of numbers, lack of skilled teachers, and modesty of means should not discourage or deter them. They must remember the glorious history of the Cause, which ... was established by dedicated souls who, for the most part, were neither rich, famous, nor well educated, but whose devotion, zeal and self-sacrifice overcame every obstacle and won miraculous victories for the Faith of God.... Let them dedicate themselves-young and old, men and women alike-and go forth and settle in new districts, travel, and teach in spite of lack of experience, and be assured that Bahá'u'lláh has promised to aid all those who arise in His Name. His strength will sustain them; their own weakness is unimportant.

Knights of Bahá'u'lláh

With heroic efforts and great sacrifice, 257 Bahá'ís arose to go to the goal countries, often with little prior knowledge of the places they were sent to. It was not easy to settle in a foreign land, learn a new language and culture, find a way to support themselves, and search for those to whom they could teach the new Faith. They earned the title Knights of Bahá'u'lláh.




