Bahá'í Geography - Crete

Crete is the largest of the Greek islands well south of the mainland. Its capital and largest city is Heraklion or Iraklion on the north shore. It achieved independence from the Ottoman Empire in 1898 and joined Greece in 1913. It is mountainous, with 30 summits of over 2,000 metres. Its population today is over 600,000.


Tablets of the Divine Plan - Europe

Knight of Bahá'u'lláh

Rolf Haug (b. 1933) was a German youth of 20 when he arrived in Iraklion on the island of Crete on 6 October 1953 and was given the title of Knight of Bahá'u'lláh. He had attended the Stockholm Intercontinental Teaching Conference in July 1953.



"The Conference itself was for me a deep spiritually moving experience, so that I spontaneously rose when the call was raised for pioneers to Greece. Greece was always a country which attracted me.... But in such a situation the actual motive is the wish to serve the holy Faith, and to put your whole trust in the Guidance of God. At such a moment one does not give one thought to the possible difficulties that may lie ahead or the problems that could arise for work or residence permission. One relies entirely on Bahá'u'lláh's promise in His Writings."

After being guided to Crete instead of mainland Greece, Rolf went by train to Athens and spent two days with American pioneers Sheila and Amin Banani before continuing on to Iraklion. The next day he rented a room with an elderly couple, and the following day found work.

"I could hardly believe it... in a Foreign land, on an Island which during World War II had suffered a great deal under the German occupation. I soon realized that I had come to the right town and the right company. Normally it was impossible for a German to receive a permission to stay or even a permission to work."

"A young man stopped me on the street. I was surprised." He knew a little German. He told me of a dream, in which he saw an exalted Person, who told him to request a book from me, and to read it. Overjoyed, I took him to my room. As he came into my room and saw the portrait of 'Abdu'I-Bahá on the wall: 'It is him who appeared to me in my dream. Who is it?', was his spontaneous question. I told him. 'And the book?', was his second question. Yes, I had a Greek edition of Bahá'u'lláh and the New Era which the couple Banani had entrusted to me."

The man's name was Manolis. "He took the book with great joy and very soon had read and studied it.... I have just passed through the great significance of this time spent in spirit and prayer when I dared to ask (a friend) the glorious question: 'Do you wish to become a Bahá'í?' One cannot measure the rapture that seized us, when, after an affirmative answer, we united in prayer and begged for steadfastness and guidance."

Teaching

Manolis became the first Cretan Bahá'í on 26 August 1954. Rolf married a Cretan girl in 1956, became the German Honorary Council of Iraklion for 33 years, and remained the rest of his life of more than 60 years on Crete.
