Prayer

We have seen the importance of prayer to our spiritual growth, along with study of the Bahá'í Writings and living a life of service to humanity. Daily prayer and study are essential to help is resist the idle fancies and vain imaginings of the insistent self within all of us.



With Divine Assistance, anything is possible. Yet we are warned that we can easily slip and fall, and lose everything when we think of ourselves and that assistance is cut off.

Bahá'u'lláh and the Master have both urged us repeatedly to disregard our own handicaps and lay our whole reliance upon God. He will come to our help if we only arise and become an active channel for God's grace.


Enoch Olinga - Cameroon


Jean Sevin – Tuamotu Archipelago

"Divine assistance is unfailing for the pioneer who turns constantly towards the world of the Kingdom. Such will be his faith, his patience, his supplications - while living his life - such will be his powers. An instant of neglect of the implications of his divine mission and divine assistance will no longer come in the same way. Over all obstacles, he can be assured of final victory but only to the extent that he tries each instant to fulfil his sacred mission, as demanded by the Master and embodied in His Tablets of the Divine Plan."
